ABOUT NORTHBAY HEALTHCARE

NorthBay Healthcare opened its first hospital in 1960 and remains Solano County's only locally based, locally managed nonprofit healthcare organization. NorthBay Medical Center in Fairfield and NorthBay VacaValley Hospital in Vacaville are known for providing quality services.

Our hospitals offer 24-hour emergency care, intensive care, and sophisticated surgical and diagnostic services. Both have maintained accreditation from The Joint Commission.

The 132-bed NorthBay Medical Center is a center of excellence for maternal and child services. Our Newborn Intensive Care Unit provides the most sophisticated services for premature or ill newborns within 50 miles. The hospital also hosts a level II Trauma Center verified by the American College of Surgeons and the NorthBay Heart & Vascular Center, the only civilian open-heart surgery center in the county. The Emergency Department is a Chest Pain Center and STEMI Receiving Center.

Our other keynote services include the NorthBay Cancer Center on the Fairfield campus, the county's first such nationally accredited center, along with the Center for Women's Health.

NorthBay VacaValley Hospital in Vacaville is the center for orthopedic specialties, pain management and hyperbaric medicine.

Our Center for Primary Care, with offices in Fairfield, Vacaville and Green Valley, is a partnership between NorthBay Healthcare and a group of respected local physicians. It comprises board-certified family practice physicians, internists and pediatricians and affiliated physician specialists throughout the Solano County region.

NorthBay Healthcare leads the way in providing advanced medicine to the people of Solano County. Our compassion, our commitment to excellence, and the depth and breadth of our services, is a testament

to our enduring commitment to the local community. We strive to ensure that local residents remain near home for most of the health care services they will need in their lifetimes.

NORTHBAY HEALTHCARE'S HISTORY OF COMMUNITY BENEFIT

NorthBay Healthcare is committed to improving the health of the Solano County community. To augment our independent efforts, NorthBay Healthcare also pursues its mission through participation in the Solano Coalition for Better Health (SCBH). Our board of directors understands that medical care is not the only factor that influences community health. Adequate housing and nutrition, education, employment and a feeling of hope and well-being also impact community wellness. By working with the Coalition, NorthBay Healthcare is able to reach beyond the walls of our facilities and positively affect a number of community health needs, in addition to medical care.

Through the Coalition, NorthBay Healthcare works collaboratively with a network of other community organizations. We are able to offer an array of health care services – our area of expertise – and benefit from the expertise of others in addressing broader social issues. As a founding member of the Coalition, NorthBay Healthcare and our board of directors play an integral role in the governance, funding and implementation of Coalition community health improvement projects. Because of this involvement, many of NorthBay Healthcare's community benefit goals and objectives are planned and completed through the Coalition.

Embracing community wellness, NorthBay Healthcare each year partners with non-profit organizations, educational institutions, public safety agencies, as well as Solano Public Health Department, to conduct activities, to build facilities, to operate programs that directly and indirectly improve the quality of life of local residents. The goal of each of these partnerships is to encourage healthy behavior, and therefore, address the needs identified in the needs assessment conducted by the Solano Coalition for Better Health.

HISTORY OF THE SOLANO COALITION FOR BETTER HEALTH

From crisis came an innovation and success. The crisis that launched the Solano Coalition for Better Health occurred in 1988. A much-needed primary care clinic in a low-income Vallejo neighborhood was in danger of closing. A small group of local physicians, government officials and hospital administrators – including NorthBay Healthcare administrative staff – met to stave off the closure.

This meeting proved to be a success, and their efforts to preserve an under-funded community clinic grew to become the Solano Coalition for Better Health. With the Coalition, the local health, government and social services communities created a vehicle that enabled them to begin addressing the complex economic, social and historical events that are transforming communities and health care delivery systems around the nation, including our own.

As the Coalition matured into a 501c3 corporation, it became the meeting ground for people interested in improving the health status of Solano County residents. The Coalition's membership then grew to include representatives from city and county governments, each of Solano County's private health care systems, the Medical Society, community leaders, non-profit agencies, business leaders and community advocates. With

this broad-based membership, the Coalition developed a vision of community health that extended to social services, health promotion, public protection, employment and education.

In July 2004, NorthBay Healthcare and its partners, Sutter Solano and Kaiser, were awarded the American Hospital Association's NOVA award for exceptional community service and partnerships in recognition of the organizations' accomplishments through their participation in the Coalition for Better Health.

Since its inception in 1988, and reaffirmed in 2005, the Coalition's mission has been and remains "to promote the health and quality of life of communities, neighborhoods, and people of Solano County by providing leadership, focusing resources, and developing partnerships." The Coalition's vision is to become "a nationally recognized model of public and private partnerships creating systems change in the provision of care and services to promote and maintain the health and safety of the people and their communities." The Eight Core Values of the Coalition are collaboration, diversity, innovation, outcomes-driven, awareness, initiative, individual responsibility and commitment.

WHO WAS INVOLVED IN THE ASSESSMENT

The 2016 CHNA was completed by Valley Vision, a regional leadership organization committed to making the Sacramento region a great place to live, work and recreate. The Solano collaborative contracted with Valley Vision in 2016 and 2013 to conduct the needs assessment. The collaborative process has built and strengthened partnerships between hospitals and other stakeholders, providing a coordinated approach to identifying priority health needs as well as developing plans to improve the health of the Sacramento region.

Valley Vision was selected to conduct the 2016 CHNAs in Solano County given its history of working with the Solano collaborative, mixed methods research skills and strong commitment to drawing attention to critical unmet health needs. Valley Vision has been a leading social enterprise and nonprofit consultancy for the Sacramento region since 1994 with the ability to deliver trusted research, design and drive multi-stakeholder initiatives and access a set of powerful leadership networks across the region.

The Valley Vision team conducted primary qualitative data collection, analyzed primary and secondary data, synthesized these data to determine the significant and prioritized health needs, documented findings and wrote the draft and final reports. Valley Vision also contracted with Dr. Heather Diaz, Dr. Mathew C. Schmidlein and Dr. Dale Ainsworth of Community Health Insights who assisted with project design, research methodology, data processing and GIS mapping for the CHNA. Community Health Insights is a Sacramento-based research-oriented consulting firm dedicated to improving the health and well-being of communities across Northern California.

6. Basic Needs (Food Security, Housing, Economic Security, Education)
7. Access to High Quality Health Care and Services
8. Pollution-Free Living and Work Environments

2017 IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY

The following describes the strategy, tactics and approach NorthBay Healthcare will employ to address four of the eight significant health needs identified in the 2016 Community Health Needs Assessment. This action plan describes programs and resources that will be committed, the expected benefit of each and the evaluation metric to be used to gauge success.

Access to Behavioral Health Services

Initiative, Activity or Program	Participate in a collaboration of local health systems, the County of Solano Health & Social Services and local mental health outpatient providers to develop new resources and the timely transfer of patients from medical centers to more appropriate centers of care in Solano County.
Description	Under the leadership and coordination of the Hospital Council of Northern and Central California, collaborate with other providers and county staff members, identify the barriers in getting patients placed in appropriate care. Determine new strategies, resources and processes that will achieve a more seamless system of care and improve the level and quantity of care available in the community.
Intended Outcome and Measurement of Success	<p>Patients being “boarded” in hospitals will get to centers of appropriate care sooner, while those ready for discharge from emergency departments will be transferred to crisis units in a more timely fashion.</p> <p>Measurement: Transfer processes will be standardized and published, available to all care providers along the continuum of behavioral health care. Solano County Board of Supervisors will receive a full report of the collaboration’s progress by year’s end 2017.</p>
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Initiative, Activity or Program	Develop an integrated Behavioral Health Team at NorthBay Healthcare.
Description	With the guidance of Psychiatrist Dr. Alexander Hazel, D.O., a Behavioral Health Team will devise a more thorough, multi-level approach to the care and management of patients with behavioral health needs. In the hospitals, the Behavioral Health Team primarily will comprise licensed clinical social workers and the psychiatrist Dr. Hazel, who will also work with three clinical psychologists who work in the primary care setting.
Intended Outcome and Measurement of Success	<p>The goal is to have a fully integrated, consistent, system-wide structure for behavior health services that will improve the quality of patient care overall.</p> <p>Measurement: Have the team comprised and functioning in the hospitals by mid-year 2017, and then begin integration into the primary care setting, conducting a pilot program in the Vacaville Center for Primary Care by year’s end.</p>

Active Living and Healthy Eating

Initiative, Activity or Program	Financially support the Play 4 All Park, Vacaville, project with a \$25,000 donation.
Description	The facility will consist of an 8,000-square-foot totally accessible play structure; two dog parks, two tee ball-sized fields, a walking trail; a Town Square and parking for 107 vehicles in South Vacaville.
Intended Outcome and Measurement of Success	<p>The park will attract thousands of nearby residents who need a safe, healthy and innovative place to exercise and play. It will attract even more users from a broader scope of the city and the county with special needs – children with disabilities, adults with physical challenges, etc.</p> <p>Measurement: All construction plans and permits will be completed with construction ready for commencement in 2018.</p>
Initiative, Activity or Program	Sponsor the 2017 Cinco K Fun Run in Fairfield
Description	In conjunction with the Police Activities League, conduct a family-oriented 5k, 10k and half-mile run/walk in early May around the Cinco de Mayo holiday. Provide a booth with health-related educational materials for families. Recruit more than 100 employees to participate in the event.
Intended Outcome and Measurement of Success	<p>Attract local residents to participate in this active lifestyle event by extolling the health benefits of walking and jogging.</p> <p>Measurement: Attract 1,000 local residents to a safe and successful event.</p>
Initiative, Activity or Program	Conduct the 2017 Ride to Defeat Diabetes
Description	A family-oriented weekend activity, Ride to Defeat Diabetes (R2D2) raises awareness of the causes of diabetes and healthy activities to prevent or manage the disease.
Intended Outcome and Measurement of Success	<p>Attract local residents to participate in a healthy lifestyle event, raise awareness, and educate participants about the disease.</p> <p>Measurement: Conduct a safe and successful event in October with more than 200 community residents riding the various courses designed by the R2D2 steering committee.</p>

Initiative, Activity or Program	Joint Mixer and community Health Fair in partnership with Vacaville and Fairfield-Suisun Chambers of Commerce.
Description	In partnership with the two local business organizations, host an inter-city program in NorthBay Green Valley Conference Center for more than 200 business people. Provide health education in trauma prevention, hands-only CPR, diabetes care and prevention, cancer treatment, heart-healthy activities and alternative medical care.
Intended Outcome and Measurement of Success	Business leaders and owners will receive a broad array of health education presentations, taking away helpful information for workforce preventive health. Measurement: Attract at least 250 community business leaders and conduct more than 12 interactive presentations that involve more than 50 clinical providers.

Safe, Crime and Violence-Free Community

Initiative, Activity or Program	Enhance programs in the after-school program with The Leaven for at-risk children
Description	The Leaven, a non-profit organization, works with members of the local community – businesses, police and fire departments, local government, school administrators and teachers, church groups and concerned neighbors – to bring after-school mentoring and tutoring programs as a revitalization tool to struggling neighborhoods where drop-out rates are out of control and gangs threaten the peace of the community. A new center was created in a troubled neighborhood adjacent to NorthBay Medical Center in Fairfield in 2016. NorthBay Healthcare provides a building facility for the program and covers all operational costs to run the program now in its second year.
Intended Outcome and Measurement of Success	Neighborhood children will continue to receive help with homework, counseling, nutritional education and health care advice. NorthBay Healthcare subject experts will become part of the curriculum and programs in 2017 and add new activities for the children in 2017. Measurement: The fully-staffed, completed center will continue to service the neighborhood. One outdoor field trip to expose children to the community’s open space amenities will be conducted in the spring or summer.

Initiative, Activity or Program	Jim Capoot ‘Charge On’ Foundation
Description	The Police Activities League program brings youth under the supervision and positive influence of a law enforcement agency and expands public awareness about the role of a police officer and the reinforcement of the responsible values and attitudes instilled in young people by their parents.

Intended Outcome and Measurement of Success	<p>Provide financial assistance as the presenting sponsor of the 2017 annual fundraising golf tournament to support the Police Activities League of Vacaville.</p> <p>Measurement: By being the presenting sponsor, attract other community partners and donors, resulting in \$15,000 in proceeds for the youth crime prevention program.</p>
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Disease Prevention, Management and Treatment

Initiative, Activity or Program	A Baby is Coming (ABC)
Description	When it was determined that the lack of consistent prenatal care for young mothers whose economic position or lifestyle choices created a risk for their soon-to-be newborns, NorthBay Healthcare created a program to ensure quality prenatal care. This service is made available for vulnerable and underserved women in the NorthBay community, regardless of the mother’s ability to pay.
Intended Outcome and Measurement of Success	<p>By expanding a “baby-wearing” project, fathers will increase their attachment and bonding experience with their baby by toting children in special carriers. Funding for the project will come from the NorthBay Guild and its volunteers.</p> <p>In addition, with closer monitoring, have more pregnant patients’ blood sugars in the target range, thereby reducing the risk of gestational diabetes.</p> <p>Measurements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ At least 100 new mothers and fathers will receive a K’tan baby carrier, and receive instructions on its purpose and proper use, by the end of 2017. ○ Implement a new program in which a pregnant patient can have an A1c blood test on site at the ABC Prenatal Program or the Center of Women’s Health, eliminating the need to drive to an outside lab. Significantly reduce the number of patients who have shown a high glucose level in their prenatal lab screening or who have a history of gestational diabetes.

Initiative, Activity or Program	Cancer Survivors Day
Description	A day of celebration and education for cancer patients and survivors in which leading oncologists from NorthBay Cancer Center present the latest in treatment, care and prevention.
Intended Outcome and Measurement of	Inspire patients and survivors to share their stories. Educate patients and their families on new treatment and after-care, as well as new breakthroughs in research and

treatment.

Measurement: Attract more than 250 participants and conduct a successful educational program featuring a member of the NorthBay Cancer Center team.

Access to High Quality Health Care and Services

Initiative, Activity or Program

NorthBay Adult Day Center

Description

NorthBay Healthcare operates the Adult Day Center which offers clients with Alzheimer’s Disease and related dementias the opportunity to socialize and participate in stimulating activities, giving caregivers the opportunity to work, resume regular activities or rest. The center is a social model program run by specially trained staff and volunteers, and is funded by NorthBay Healthcare with support from Area Agency on Aging and nominal fees from clients. The Day Center is open Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Intended Outcome and Measurement of Success

Increase community awareness of Alzheimer’s and dementia and the impact on individuals, their families and the community. Provide care for productive activities for clients while providing caregivers much-needed respite. Meanwhile, build more financial support for the program.

Measurements:

- Be the lead sponsor of Walk to End Alzheimer's in collaboration with the Alzheimer’s Association, and establish Team NorthBay to show support and to be the leading health care organization in Solano County at the event.
 - Enroll more staff members in community awareness events in 2017.
 - Continue support groups operating in Rio Vista and Vacaville.
 - Offer additional educational workshops on Alzheimer’s and caregiving to enhance community awareness and offer support to caregivers of others with dementia.
 - Submit a completed application for continued funding through the Area Agency on Aging by July 1, 2017, with funds to be used to offer scholarships to needy families.
 - Apply for a Wells Fargo community benefit grant.
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Initiative, Activity or Program

Transitional Housing & Care for Homeless

Description

The program provides a safe environment for homeless, or near homeless patients who are ready for discharge from acute care hospitals in Solano County and connect these patients with primary care, long-term housing and other resources to support their recovery and prevent readmissions. NorthBay Healthcare, along with Solano County, Sutter and Kaiser contribute funds to sustain this program. The project has contracted

with the Community Action Council of Benicia to provide case management and respite housing in Fairfield and Vallejo. The project saves the hospitals inpatient days by providing a safe place to discharge patients who are medically ready to leave the hospital but have no place to recover.

Intended Outcome and Measurement of Success

Homeless individuals will be connected to primary and preventive care providers, employment assistance and other wrap-around services to create a stable foundation from which to improve their health, prevent readmission to the hospital and to reduce the burden on hospitals by reducing their inpatient days.

Measurements:

- Enroll 60 homeless or near homeless clients referred by the hospitals with respite, transitional housing and linkage to services, including mental health.
- Identify respite housing options for patients who need wheelchair accessibility.

Initiative, Activity or Program

Solano Kids Insurance Program (SKIP)

Description

SKIP is a program to identify and enroll uninsured children and their parents in a health coverage program. Outreach is targeted to schools, businesses, churches and neighborhoods with the goal of achieving children’s health coverage rates above the statewide average for public programs.

Intended Outcome and Measurement of Success

Increase the percentage of youngsters in Solano County that have insurance coverage and access to primary and preventive care, as well as inpatient services.

Measurements:

- SKIP will enroll 2,500 Solano County adults and children in Covered California, expanded Medi-Cal, Healthy Kids or other free or low-cost health insurance programs.
- SKIP will assist 1,500 low-income residents re-enroll in health coverage.
- All 51 Solano County elementary schools will be screened for student insured status. New strategies will be designed to reach uninsured middle and high school students.
- SKIP will enroll 500 members of hard-to-reach populations including young men of color, and those re-entering the community after incarceration, mental health or substance abuse treatment.

Initiative, Activity or Program

Hospice & Bereavement Services

Description

NorthBay’s Medicare-certified hospice and bereavement services are offered to anyone, regardless of insurance or ability to pay, whether in the home, hospital, nursing home or board-and-care facility. The multidisciplinary staff includes specially trained nurses, home health aides, rehabilitation therapists, social workers, chaplains and volunteers.

Intended Outcome and Measurement of Success

Increase the admission of hospice patients in 2017, extending the program’s reach in Solano County. Meanwhile, expand the pool of volunteers to ensure adequate staff to serve as many patients as possible. In addition, expand the bereavement program to satisfy the growing demand for such services by military veterans in the community

Measurements:

- Increase admissions by 10 percent over 2016 total.
 - Increase the existing pool of volunteers by recruiting at least 10 new volunteers.
 - Achieve Level 4 in the “We Honor Veterans’ program in 2017 and determine the feasibility of conducting a “butterfly release” awareness event.
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NEEDS NOT ADDRESSED BY NORTHBAY HEALTHCARE

As an independent, community-based health system, NorthBay Healthcare cannot address each and every health need or deficiency identified in its community. However, it is committed to providing support and resources to others who directly take on several of the needs pinpointed in the assessment.

The implementation strategy, however, does not include specific plans to address the following:

Affordable and Accessible Transportation – Public transportation is managed by cities and the Solano Transportation Authority. It does not come under the purview of local health care systems.

Basic Needs – NorthBay Healthcare’s mission in the community does not include housing, economic security, education.

Pollution-Free Living and Work Environments – Environmental review and protection is another area of grave concern to health care providers, but creating a pollution-free environment is best managed by subject experts in that realm.

Organization	Vacaville Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club
Event, Activity, Program	Serving troubled neighborhoods, the organization provides a safe, productive place for kids to spend out-of-school time. It inspires youth to believe in themselves and to enhance their lives through the programs brought to them by a compassionate staff.
Organization	Salvation Army Kroc Center, Suisun City
Event, Activity, Program	Located in a disadvantaged neighborhood, the Kroc Center, founded by philanthropist Jane Kroc, provides at-risk children a safe haven to grow academically and physically. NorthBay Healthcare partners with the center to provide health education and free immunizations.

Event, Activity, Program	Annual four-day camp for high school students who are interested in the nursing
